

A note on the Table of Contents

Entries in the Guide are alphabetically ordered according to the key word we believe would most naturally occur to a person seeking a particular listing. Therefore, the Department of Correction is under C for "Correction," the Department of Arkansas Heritage under H for "Heritage," and so forth. In such cases where an agency or institution is best known by its full name—the State Police, for example—those entries are so ordered.

Those boards whose names begin "Arkansas State Board of..." are arranged under B for "Board"; all others are according to their key words (e.g., Arkansas State Medical Board under M; Plant Board under P). Agencies and institutions that are subdivisions of other agencies are grouped alphabetically beneath their umbrella organization; thus, the State Library appears under the Department of Education, Arkansas State University under the Department of Higher Education, etc.



The General Assembly

The Arkansas Constitution calls for the General Assembly to convene on the second Monday in January of odd-numbered years for a regular session, limited to sixty (60) calendar days; and on the second Monday in February of even-numbered years for a fiscal session limited to thirty (30) calendar days. Regular sessions can be extended not to exceed a total of seventy-five (75) calendar days by a vote of two-thirds of the members elected to each chamber. (In addition, a regular session of the legislature can be extended beyond seventy-five (75) days by a vote of three-fourths of the members elected to each chamber (Arkansas Constitution, Article V, §19).) Fiscal sessions may be extended one (1) time not to exceed an additional fifteen (15) calendar days by a vote of three-fourths of the members elected to each chamber.

It is not unusual for the General Assembly to address as many as 3000 bills and resolutions in a session. Many of these matters have been studied by committees during the interim and discussed at various public meetings.

In addition to the regular session, the Governor may call special sessions (extraordinary) to consider only those matters that the Governor recommends. In these cases, members of the General Assembly can only introduce bills relating to the subjects in the Governor's Proclamation. However, after these matters have been disposed of, the General Assembly may extend special sessions for up to fifteen (15) calendar days by a two-thirds vote of the membership of both bodies and the Assembly may consider any matter.

The General Assembly is highly structured so that it can deal effectively with all issues. There are two houses—the Senate and the House of Representatives. The Senate has 35 members; the House has 100. The Lieutenant Governor presides as President of the Senate; and the Speaker of the House, who is elected by House members at the beginning of each regular session, presides in the House.

Many improvements have been made over the years to update and modernize the legislative process.

Committee meetings are open to the public; and, as an additional service to the public and news media, bills once filed, are available on the internet.

Space is made available for the news media by both the Senate and House, and the House Communications Office produces a daily radio news program and provides news summaries and press releases to the state newspapers. The Senate Information Office also works with the public and the news media.

The General Assembly's Tour Guide Service assists thousands of visitors who tour the Capitol during sessions. Visitors may arrange to visit their senator or representative during the session by calling one of the legislature's in-session numbers–501-682-6211 for the House of Representatives and 501-682-2902 for the Senate.

The thirty-five members of the Senate are elected from thirty-five senatorial districts.

A senator must be at least 25 years of age, a resident of Arkansas for two years, and a resident of the senatorial district for one year.

The Lieutenant Governor is the President of the Senate and presides during the sessions. The current Lieutenant Governor is Mark Darr. Senator Michael Lamoureux of Russellville is President Pro Tempore of the Senate. Mr. Lamoureux will be second in the line of succession to the office of Governor.

Members of the Senate's nine standing committees report back to the Senate after consideration of proposed legislation. The standing committees are Public Health, Welfare and Labor; Revenue and Taxation; Education; Judiciary; Agriculture, Economic and Industrial Development; Insurance and Commerce; City, County and Local Affairs; State Agencies and Governmental Affairs; and Transportation, Technology and Legislative Affairs. In general, each senator serves on two of these committees.


The members, chairmen, and vice-chairmen are chosen by a process that relies on seniority.

In addition to the Standing Committees, the Senate has two select committees: Rules, Resolutions and Memorials; and Efficiency. Also, there are seven joint committees: Joint Budget; Joint Performance Review; Joint Public Retirement and Social Security Systems; Joint Committee on Children and Youth; Joint Legislative Facilities; Joint Energy; and Joint Audit.

The House of Representatives consists of 100 members who are elected from 100 Districts. The House is currently has 51 Republicans, 48 Democrats and 1 Green Party, of which 83 are men and 17 are women.

A House member must be at least 21 years of age and a resident of Arkansas for two years and a resident of the district for one year. Members of the House serve two-year terms.

The Speaker of the House presides and is elected by the membership every two years. The Speaker for the 2013 - 2014 biennium is Davy Carter of Cabot. It is customary for the Speaker to designate a Speaker Pro Tempore, who presides in the absence of the Speaker.

The House utilizes an electronic voting system. To vote, a member pushes one of three (3) buttons on his or her desk: the green button means "yes," the red but ton "no," and the yellow button "present."

The votes are displayed on two (2) large electronic boards at the front of the House Chamber and are tabulated at the Speaker's desk. A computer printout of the tabulations is placed into the official journal and the results are placed on the internet.

Because the House Chamber is large and there are 100 members, each member has a microphone. When a member wishes to speak, he stands to be recognized by the Speaker. Once recognized, the member speaks into the microphone, which is turned on by the Sound Clerk at the large desk in the front of the Chamber.


The Representatives spend a lot of their time in committee meetings, sometimes months before the convening of the session. The House has ten (10) Standing Committees. Each Representative serves on two (2) Standing Committees. No member can serve as a Chairman or Vice Chairman of more than one (1) Standing or Select Committee.

In addition to the Standing Committees, the House of Representatives has seven (7) Select Committees which are: House Management; Rules; Joint Budget; the Joint Committee on Public Retirement and Social Security Programs; the Joint Committee on Energy; Joint Performance Review Committee; and the Joint Committee on Advanced Communications and Information Technology. The House also has three (3) Special Committees, the House Committee on the Journal, Engrossed and Enrolled Bills; the Joint Interim Committee on Legislative Facilities; and the Joint Committee on Legislative Printing Requirements and Specifications.



The Commissioner of State Lands ensures the collection and distribution of revenue from delinquent real estate taxes. During a two-year period after certification to the state, property owners are notified by the State Land Office of tax delinquency, and given the opportunity to pay all taxes, penalties, interest, and fees. The commissioner returns monies collected to the county of origin, revenue that is then redistributed to the original county taxing units.

Properties that are not redeemed are eligible for public auction, conducted by the Commissioner of State Lands, in the county of origin. On the average, between 85-90% of certified parcels are redeemed by the original property owner. The remaining parcels either sell at public auction or remain available for purchase through a negotiated sales process.



John Thurston Commissioner

The Commissioner of State Lands' office houses original patent information for the State of Arkansas, as well as original General Land Office survey plats and field notes. The commissioner provides access to information from these and other historical documents to the general public. Deeds to state-owned property are also filed with the State Land Office. The commissioner serves as Chairman of the Natural Resources Committee, which regulates oil, gas, coal, and sand and gravel leases on state-owned property, and is a permanent member of the Arkansas Natural and Cultural Resources Council.







In 2005, Senate Bill 383 renamed the Post Prison Transfer Board, the Arkansas Parole Board (APB). The move was designed to alleviate confusion on the part of the public regarding Board responsibilities. There are seven (7) Board members and each member is appointed by the Governor to a term of seven (7) years. Throughout the year, designated Board members interview inmates at the various Arkansas Department of Correction and Arkansas Department of Community Correction facilities across the state. Members travel to the various units for parole, transfer, pardons, or commutation hearings. The Parole Board conducts two Board meetings that are generally held on the second and fourth Thursday of each month in which votes are ratified and the public is allowed to attend. The Parole Board conducts two Victim Input Hearings, which are generally held on the first and third Wednesday of each month. Victim Input Hearings are closed to the public. The office of the Parole Board is open Monday thru Friday, from 8:00am to 4:30pm.



The Arkansas Department of Community Correction (DCC) was established in 1993 as the Arkansas Department of Community Punishment through legislation that consolidated statewide probation and parole efforts and established Residential Community Correction Centers. In 2001, the DCC sought and was granted permission by the State Legislature to change the punishment component of its name to correction to more accurately reflect the Agency's mission.

The DCC provides supervision and services, that are consistent with the principles of evidence-based practices, to adult offenders in the community through its five Community Correction Centers, Technical Violator Center and 51 parole and probation offices. These services strike a balance between rehabilitation, supervision and accountability so that the community is repaid of the offense, public safety is promoted and the offender is assisted in becoming a law-abiding, tax-paying member of society.

The DCC partner with Circuit Judges throughout the state in 41 drug courts that provide an alternative to traditional incarceration through intensive supervision to offenders who have substance abuse issues that lead to criminal behavior.

The DCC has approximately 1200 employees. Other major programs include Technical Violation Programs, specialized sex offender supervision and modified therapeutic communities.



The Disability Determination for Social Security Administration (DDSSA) determines whether a person meets the medical disability provisions for benefits under the Federal Social Security Act. These provisions are not necessarily the same as those used in other government or private disability programs, and a person may qualify under other programs and not qualify for social security disability.

The social security disability program consists of two distinct benefit areas: social security disability insurance under title II of the Act and supplemental security income (SSI) under title XVI of the Act. Title II benefits are a partial replacement for the worker and his family's lost earnings when the worker suffers a severe disability. Title II claimants must have been gainfully employed for five of the past ten years in work covered by social security. Worker ben-

efits are based on the worker's earnings. After 24 months of title II benefits, claimants are eligible for Medicare coverage.

The title XVI disability benefits program provides income for individuals with severe disabilities who have limited income and resources. Title XVI benefits are funded through general tax revenues and individuals who qualify under these provisions also qualify for Medicaid assistance.


An adult under either title must, because of his disability, be unable to engage in any substantial gainful activity by reason of any medically determinable physical or mental impairment expected to last for a continuous period of not less than 12 months, or death.

Currently, Arkansas citizens receive 192 million dollars in monthly disability benefits under the Federal Social Security Act. DDSSA appreciates that these benefits are vital to a large number of Arkansas citizens, and DDSSA continues to pursue its ultimate goal of qualifying any claimant who may be eligible under the federal social security disability rules and regulations.

The Arkansas Department of Emergency Management (ADEM) provides assistance to Arkansas cities and counties to plan for and recover from disasters and emergencies, whether they are natural, such as earthquakes, severe weather, disease outbreak; technological, including chemical spills and radiological incidents; or man caused terrorism, including weapons of mass destruction, bioterrorism, and/or other unconventional warfare. The ADEM Director, David Maxwell, is also the state Homeland Security Adviser.

ADEM planners help jurisdictions design emergency operations plans to best utilize local resources. ADEM trainers teach emergency responders, state agency personnel, and community leaders to work as a team during emergencies and disasters. ADEM's objective is always to mitigate the effects of a disaster to property and to ensure the health, welfare, and safety of our citizens, coordinating all our

resources. Through speaking engagements and booths at fairs and festivals, ADEM helps the public learn about disasters and actions they may need to take to protect themselves. ADEM also works with communities to secure grants for mitigation projects to protect property from future damage.

During a disaster, ADEM is the state's coordinating agency, matching needs on the scene with available resources. ADEM contacts state, federal, and volunteer agencies to secure the needed resources and help. If the situation escalates beyond the state's resources, ADEM works with the Governor to request a Presidential Disaster Declaration. In a federally declared disaster, ADEM works with the Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to ensure the people of Arkansas receive all the federal assistance available. This is a 24 hours a day, seven days a week agency of State Government, responding to emergency situations of every nature throughout the state and nation.



The Ethics Commission was created by the citizens in Arkansas who voted overwhelmingly to institute strong ethics and disclosure as part of the law in Arkansas. In 1988, voters passed a law (Initiated Act 1 of 1988) which required public officials to reveal their financial connections and how those connections might affect their public duties. The act also detailed which actions a public official can or cannot take, when the actions affect officials, their immediate family, or business associates. Lobbyists are required under that law to register before they can legally operate in Arkansas and disclose their lobbying activity thereafter.

In 1990, another law passed by the voters created the Ethics Commission and added new laws dealing with the money used to finance political campaigns. The new law dealt more directly with activities that elected officials, especially legislators, were prohibited from taking. The law gave the new Ethics Commission authority to investigate alleged violations of the ethics and disclosure laws, and to take disciplinary actions against those who were found guilty. In addition, the Commission interprets all aspects of the law, issues opinions, and provides education and training to persons subject to the laws under its jurisdiction. The Commission and its staff answer questions and provide guidance to elected officials, appointed officials, lobbyists, campaign finance officials, public employees, and the ordinary citizen.

The Arkansas State University System was formally established by Board of Trustees resolution on July 1, 2006, but Arkansas State University began expanding beyond the original campus in Ionesboro in 1955. Today, the ASU System includes campuses at Jonesboro, which offers degree programs through the doctoral level, and at Beebe, Mountain Home, and Newport, where associate degree programs are offered. ASU-Heber Springs and ASU-Searcy are operated as sister campuses of ASU-Beebe. The ASU Technical Centers at Marked Tree and Jonesboro are affiliated with ASU-Newport.

ASU-Jonesboro also offers bachelor's degree programs, master's degree programs, and upper level courses through ASU degree centers at ASU-Beebe, ASU-Mountain Home, and three other cities-Blytheville, Forrest City and West Memphis—where partnership agreements have been established in cooperation with

local community colleges. Instructional sites are located at nearby Paragould and at Little Rock Air Force Base. In the fall of 2012, the system campuses enrolled more than 22,000 students.

In addition to the various academic programs leading to degrees, the Arkansas State University System supports significant programs for the state and region including economic development initiatives, leadership in the Arkansas Biosciences Institute, and Arkansas Heritage Sites at Piggott, Tyronza, Lakeport and Dyess.

The Board of Trustees of Arkansas State University governs the university system and is composed of five members who serve staggered five-year terms. The Board appoints the President of the ASU System and approves its operational policies and direction.







Recognized as one of the most attractive campuses in Arkansas, the Henderson campus features modern brick academic and residential buildings connected by landscaped pedestrian malls. Student housing options include co-ed suite-style units, traditional-style units and apartments. The Dunn

Student Recreation Center, which features a climbing wall and a state-of-the-art weight room, was

designed to accommodate students' increasing interest in health and wellness. The facility was recently cited for Outstanding Design in the Sports Stadiums/Athletic Facilities category of American School & University magazine's Architectural Portfolio. The new Simonson Biological Field Station, a research facility with residential capabilities located on Lake DeGray, opened in spring 2012. Construction is currently underway on a new 20,000-square-foot dining facility.

The Division of Behavioral Health Services (DBHS) provides an integrated system of public mental health care and alcohol, tobacco, and other drug prevention, treatment, and recovery services to Arkansas residents. The DBHS contracts with 12 community mental health centers and two specialty community mental health clinics, 25 substance abuse providers, and 13 prevention resource centers that blanket the state to create a comprehensive system of behavioral health care services and prevention.

DBHS is responsible for oversight and operation of the Arkansas State Hospital (ASH) in Little Rock and the Arkansas Health Center (AHC) in Benton. The ASH is a psychiatric inpatient treatment facility for those with mental or emotional disorders which includes

90 adult acute inpatient beds; a 96-bed forensic treatment services program which offers assistance to circuit courts throughout the state; 18 adolescent acute inpatient beds; and 18 adolescent sex offender beds. The AHC is a 310-bed long-term care psychiatric nursing facility, which serves the needs of elderly Arkansans with disabilities who require specialized services and programs not generally available through community nursing homes.

In addition, DBHS is responsible for the certification and licensure of behavioral health providers. DBHS licenses institutions that operate Substance Abuse Treatment programs, monitors programs for compliance with state regulations, and is the State Opioid maintenance treatment authority. It also sets standards for and certifies organizations as being eligible to be providers of Medicaid-funded rehabilitation services for persons with mental illness and substance abuse treatment services.



Counselors also travel to homes and job sites at the convenience of consumers to deliver or monitor whatever training, equipment and services are needed to achieve consumer goals. Independent small businesses, such as the Vending Facility "Food Service" Program are developed, monitored and supported by DSB staff in conjunction with consumers. The purpose of the Division of Child Care and Early Childhood Education is to ensure that Arkansas children have access to a safe, high-quality, nurturing learning environments to prepare them for future success.

Licensing and Quality Accreditation

- Child Care Licensing Minimum Licensing Requirements include rules for, but not limited to, health, safety, fire, staff/child ratio, supervision, behavior guidance, transportation, staff qualifications, nutrition, grounds and program.
- Placement and Residential Licensing Unit Specialists license and monitor Youth Residential, Emergency Residential, Psychiatric Residential Treatment, Sexual Offender, and Independent Living Facilities and Child Placement Agencies that place children in foster and adoptive homes and in residential facilities.
- Better Beginnings This is a voluntary quality rating improvement system available to child care centers and homes that meet standards higher than the basic licensing requirements. Better Beginnings provides financial incentives to facilities that meet and maintain these higher standards.

- Family Support Provides child care assistance for eligible families. Applications are available on-line and at the local DHS offices.
- Program Support Services are available for providers including professional development, technical assistance, and incentive grants. School readiness initiatives and literacy training for early education providers are offered to ensure that all children are ready for school success.

Arkansas Better Chance for School Success (ABC) - The Arkansas Better Chance (ABC) for School Success Program, ranked as one of the top ten pre-k programs in the country, offers high quality early education services to children birth to five serving approximately 25,000 children.

Child Health and Nutrition - Child Health and Nutrition Programs are federally funded programs that reimburse for nutritious meals (breakfast, lunch and snacks) served by providers and sponsors.

Program Compliance - This unit ensures that participating providers and families meet the requirements of programs. Technical assistance is provided when necessary.



The Office of Systems and Technology (OST) is the lead technical organization for providing the Arkansas Department of Human Services (DHS) with information technology services and solutions. OST is responsible for the management, development and maintenance of the Department's information systems and is headed by the DHS Chief Information Officer (CIO). The CIO sets the overall technical direction of the system support operations, directs all future technology development and oversees the work of any outsource vendor. These services are provided to the Department through four major sections, Technical Support Services, User Support Services, OST Administration, and CHRIS Management.

The Technical Services section is responsible for coordinating technical initiatives and activities among private contractors, the Department of Information Systems, and the program divisions. This section also has responsibility for coordinating the hardware, software, and connectivity issues for the Department including determining PC and software needs; monitoring network and desktop support issues and help desk activities; maintaining and updating DHS Internet and Intranet websites; and providing technical assistance to other divisions in regard to technology trends. Eight field support technical services specialists in the counties outlying Pulaski are included in this section; they provide technical staff to support local and wide area networks; coordinating the technical initiatives in the field; identifying and resolving connectivity problems. The User Support Services section is responsible for assisting user with the department's departmental-wide productivity tools, such as Microsoft Office, Sharepoint, and Edoctus.

The Administrative Support section is responsible for coordinating the divisions' information system administrative functions. This section is responsible for developing Advance Planning Documents (APDs), preparing Information Systems RFPs, approving and ordering all equipment and software that is to be placed on the DHS network, and monitoring outsource contracts. The section is also responsible for preparing and monitoring the division's budget in AASIS and coordinating the Information Technology Plan (ITP) with the Department of Finance and Administration.

The CHRIS Management section is responsible for the maintenance and operations of the Children's Reporting and Information System (CHRIS). 



The mission of the Oil and Gas Commission is to regulate the drilling and spacing of wells for production of the crude oil, natural gas, and brine (bromine industry), and ensure production of those resources occurs in an environmentally safe manner.

The commission was created by Act 105 of 1939, which provides that the commission will 1) prevent waste, 2) foster and encourage conservation of crude oil and natural gas, and 3) protect the vested co-equal or correlative rights of ownership associated with the production of oil, natural gas, and brine, and 4) protect the environment during the production process. The act also authorizes the commission to prescribe rules, regulations and orders; provides for spacing of wells and the formation of drilling units and force pooling or integration of these units; and provides for penalties for violation of the provisions of the act. Act 937 of 1979 placed the brine (bromine related) industry under the control of the Arkansas Oil and Gas Commission.

The board collects license and inspection fees from all phases of the agricultural industry under its jurisdiction and is self-supporting except for the survey and quarantine programs, part of the public grain warehouse work, and the Bureau of Standards.
