Next Steps Initiative

The Donald W. Reynolds Foundation is a national philanthropic organization founded in 1954 by the late media entrepreneur for whom it is named. Headquartered in Las Vegas, Nevada, the Foundation has committed over \$215 million to improving the lives of elderly people throughout the United States.

The Foundation's Trustees have determined to bring its resources to bear in strengthening physicians' training in geriatrics. A demographic tidal wave of the elderly will soon sweep over the United States, thanks to the baby boom and life-extending medical, public health, economic and social advances. It will pose extraordinary challenges for physicians as the number of frail elders more than doubles over the next thirty years.

Most physicians today lack adequate training to meet the needs of the frail elderly patient. Such patients typically suffer from multiple, interactive physical and psychosocial conditions – both acute and chronic – that compromise their capacity to function in daily life and lessen their independence and quality of life.

Objective of Call for Proposals

The Reynolds Foundation has now funded four separate cohorts of geriatrics training grants and one previous Next Steps cohort, totaling an almost \$90 million investment in geriatrics medical education nationally. Based on the accomplishments of Reynolds-funded schools and the continued need to train physicians in the care of older patients, the Foundation's Trustees have created an additional opportunity for our most successful grantees.

To build on the good work and significant contributions of previous grantees, the-Foundation-solicits-proposals for-*Next Steps in-Strengthening-Geriatrics-Medical Education, II.* Proposals must focus on one of two areas of interest to the Foundation:

1) Geriatrics training for physicians who are hospitalists and surgical and medical specialists, and

2) Improving the ability of physicians to work with other health disciplines in teams to provide better care for older persons.

STATEMENT 12 PAGE 3 of 23 Of particular interest under this program are initiatives that are highly innovative and promise long-lasting, value-added impact and that respond to the Institute of Medicine's 2008 workforce report "Retooling for an Aging America." As in the past, key to successful proposals will be a combination of commitment at an institution's highest level to the program's goals, clearly defined objectives, and the availability of sufficient geriatric expertise to achieve those objectives.

Proposed activities may address either of the areas of interest, described in greater detail below. They should be sufficiently comprehensive to have a meaningful impact on a substantial number of medical students, residents and/or practicing physicians. They should be aimed at developing and demonstrating the acquisition of geriatric knowledge, practice skills, and care coordination and at training physicians to optimally manage the clinical conditions and special problems of the frail elderly. Also important, these activities must lead to changes in training at the institution that will be maintained beyond Reynolds Foundation support. Successful applicants will be expected to post products, program materials and evaluations developed on the ADGAP/Donald W. Reynolds academic clearinghouse, Portal of Geriatric Online Education (www.pogoe.org).

Possible Activities

Proposals must focus on innovations in geriatrics education and care coordination encompassing one of two categories at the grantee institution:

Training of hospitalists and surgical and medical specialists. Proposals could meet the need to strengthen the geriatrics training of such internal medicine specialties as cardiology, gastroenterology, oncology, nephrology, or hospitalists, or such specialties as emergency medicine, gynecology, urology, psychiatry, surgery, orthopedics, or ophthalmology. Levels of training may include residency and fellowship training, chief resident training, and/or faculty development. (Stipends for fellowships will not be permitted.)

_Training physicians to learn to work-optimally-with other disciplines. — The other disciplines could include nursing, pharmacy, social work, physicians' assistants, and non-professional team members. Of particular interest are sustainable models, for example the medical home, that change care delivery to optimize the contribution of every team member and maximize efficiency. The emphasis should be on training physicians how to work best in these teams, including communicating with team members.

As in the past, important areas of consideration include factors such as faculty recruitment and development, the development of new educational techniques and methodologies, including methods to assess learners' competencies in these

STATEMENT 12 PAGE 4 of 23 areas, and the existence or creation of infrastructure to support proposed programs.

Partnering with other institutions is acceptable.

Scale of Program and Individual Grants

The Reynolds Foundation expects to commit up to \$10 million under this Call for Proposals. Approximately ten grants will be awarded, each totaling up to \$1 million (including indirect costs; see below) over four years, with a limit of \$250,000 in each grant year.

<u>Eligibility</u>

Academic health centers that have received third or fourth cohort geriatrics training grants from the Donald W. Reynolds Foundation and are in good standing and the Universities of Arkansas and Oklahoma are eligible to apply.

<u>Requirements</u>

Initiatives proposed in response to this invitation must meet the following requirements:

- 1. The appropriate dean(s) and responsible officers, including relevant department chairs and program directors, must demonstrate their tangible commitment to the proposed activities and sign the proposal.
- 2. The individual(s) responsible for the project must be sufficiently empowered within the institution to fulfill the goals of the project.
- 3. Funds requested under the proposed grant must be matched for each of the four years of the grant: one dollar from the grantee institution for every two dollars from the Foundation. Indirect costs will not be considered as matching funds. (In the case of endowments, only the expended income generated by an endowment qualifies for the match.)
- 4. The grantee institution must pay at least half the total compensation of any individual for whom grant support is requested, regardless of the individual's effort on this grant.
- 5. The grantee institution must commit itself to supporting grant-funded activities and positions beyond the grant's termination.

Grant Selection Process

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Grants under this initiative will be awarded on a competitive basis by the Foundation's Trustees, taking into account the recommendations of an expert advisory panel.

The selection process will be in two steps. The <u>first step</u> requires the submission of a full proposal, including the components described below. Finalists will be selected based on a review of those proposals by the expert advisory panel. In the <u>second step</u>, the Foundation will arrange for a video-conference with each Finalist institution, the Foundation and the Foundation's advisory panel. The advisory panel will then make its recommendations to the Foundation's Trustees.

Timetable

A mandatory letter stating the institution's intent to submit a proposal should be received by the Foundation by August 31, 2012. Please specify in the letter whether your institution intends to focus on geriatrics training for non primary care disciplines, or improving interdisciplinary team care.

Proposals must be received (not postmarked) by the Foundation by 5:00 p.m. Pacific Standard Time, January 14, 2013. A signed original plus seven copies of the proposal should be submitted.

Finalists will be notified no later than February 28, 2013.

Video-conferences for Finalists will be scheduled March 25-27, 2013.

Awards will be announced no later than May 28, 2013.

Grant-supported activities will commence July 1, 2013.

Selection Criteria

The following major factors will be considered in the evaluation of proposals. This list is intended to assist institutions in determining the appropriateness of candidacy. All of the factors will enter into the consideration of proposals, though the relative weight given each may differ from case to case. They are not listed in any specific order of priority.

- The innovativeness of the proposed project.
- The "value-added" of the project, as measured by the gap that will be filled between the institution's current geriatrics training and projected project results.
- The potential impact of the project.
- The ability of the project, if successful, to be disseminated to other institutions.
- Demonstrated, tangible commitment of the institution's leadership to strengthening training in geriatrics.
- Strength and qualifications in geriatrics of those who will be responsible for leading and implementing the proposed project.
- The quality of the institution's existing general medical student, residency and continuing medical education programs.
- Institutional resources and unique facilities and technologies available to the proposed project.
- A plan to evaluate the results of the program and learner outcomes.
- The extent and nature of the institution's financial commitment to continuing project activities and personnel after the proposed grant's termination.
- The appropriateness of the proposed budget.

Components of the Proposal

A proposal should not exceed 12 single-spaced pages in length, excluding cover sheet, timeline, biographical profiles, budget and IRS letter(s). Font size must be 11-point or larger Arial or Helvetica, with no less than one-inch margins to the page. The proposal should include the following information:

- A cover sheet that includes the name and address of the institution, title of the project, amount and term of the requested grant, proposed date of project initiation, name and contact information of the individual responsible for the project, and the appropriate signatures, as specified in Requirements, above.
- A one-page summary of the proposed project.
- As applicable, a summary of the events that have occurred since your last site visit by the Foundation that have changed your environment or affect proposed activities.
- Information outlining post-grant institutional financial and leadership support for the activities funded under the Foundation's previous, geriatrics training grant and explanation for any programs that are no longer in existence.

- A brief description of the existing specific curriculum, courses and training activities related to geriatrics and to the groups targeted under the proposal for strengthened geriatrics training. Describe how activities conducted during the prior Reynolds funding period have led to the proposed activities.
- A detailed description of the activities proposed for grant support and their expected impact.
- If applicable, a section outlining any work by other awardees that will be implemented at the grantee institution; include any letters of support from other grantees as appendices.
- Any additional background information deemed relevant by the institution.
- A detailed description, not exceeding two pages, of an evaluation plan to measure the impact of the proposed activities, including comparison with meaningful baseline information.
- A one-page, four-year timeline outlining proposed project activities.
- Detailed budget and budget justification, using the instructions and format attached to this call for proposals.
- Biographical profiles, not exceeding two pages each, of current faculty whose expertise in geriatrics would be tapped for the proposed activities and of other faculty who would participate in the project.
- IRS letter(s).

Indirect Costs and Fringe Benefits

The Foundation has established that a grantee institution under this program may receive an indirect cost rate of 20% of direct grant expenditures, excluding subcontracts. Indirect costs may be paid to subcontractors but they may not exceed 20%.

Fringe benefits may not exceed the institution's federally approved rate.

The grantee institution may not apply expenditures in excess of the above provisions for fringe benefits in calculating its match of grant funds. Matching on indirect costs is not allowed.

Expenditures Not Allowed under Grant Budget

- More than half the amount of any individual's salary and benefits.
- Stipends for fellowships, including geriatrics-subspecialty fellowships.
- Tuition costs or laboratory fees for work leading to an MD or PhD (Special courses or other preparation in geriatrics, curriculum development, etc. are permitted for those holding the MD or PhD).
- Construction or renovation of buildings.
- The cost of participation in and travel to scientific or educational conferences or meetings unless for purposes or activities directly and explicitly linked to specific project goals and activities.

• Items ordinarily considered to be overhead (i.e. lights, rent, office furniture, janitorial services, etc.) will be allowed only as part of the indirect costs provision.

Evaluation and Monitoring

Grants awarded under this program will be evaluated regularly by Foundation staff and/or consultants. Evaluation entails site visits. Grantees will be required to submit annual progress and expenditure reports.

<u>Liability</u>

The Donald W. Reynolds Foundation is not responsible for any claim, judgment, award, damages, settlement, negligence or malpractice arising from training, research, or other activities related to an award. The grantee institution must acknowledge responsibility for activities related to an award, and release the Donald W. Reynolds Foundation from all claims or liability that may arise from the conduct of such activities related to an award resulting from any act or omission on the part of the institution, its employees, agents or representatives.
